Name of Creator

Nazareth Hall records created under the oversight of the Moravian Congregation of Bethlehem, Provincial Helpers' Conference (PHC) and Provincial Elders' Conference (PEC) in North America.

Administrative/Biographical History

Upon settling in Pennsylvania's Lehigh Valley in the early 1740s, Moravians soon began the process of establishing schools to educate the youth of their communities, missionaries, and the indigenous people they served in the mission fields. Separate schools were established for boys and girls. The first school for Moravian boys was established in 1743 in the log cabin next to the Whitefield House in Nazareth. Over the next forty years, the location of the school changed many times, although instruction remained continuous. In 1745, this school was moved to the estate of Henry Antes in Frederick Township, Montgomery County, and then dissolved in 1750 when many of the pupils transferred to another Moravian boarding school in Oley in Berks Township. The school in Oley lasted only another year due to deteriorating financial conditions, and was moved to Salisbury [Maguntsche] in Lehigh Township in 1751. In the course of reorganization and threat of Native American attack, the school was moved back and forth to Bethlehem in 1753 and 1755. In subsequent years, the school's numbers grew, requiring a larger space. In 1759, the boys moved to the Manor House in Nazareth, and remained there for twenty years, until financial hardship caused by the American Revolution caused it to be moved back to Bethlehem in 1779. After another period of reorganization, the school was reopened in Nazareth in 1785, where it operated as Nazareth Hall, a high-quality boarding school for Moravians and non-Moravians alike. In

1862, the school organized the pupils into cadet companies and introduced military drill, a tradition it kept until its closing in 1929.

Archival History

The Nazareth Hall record group is an artificial collection, a collection of materials with unknown provenance assembled and organized to facilitate its management or use. At this time, it is not clear how and when these materials came to be deposited at MHS, however it seems likely they were placed here sometime after the dissolution of the school in 1929. In the past, it seems that the collection was organized at the item level by staff or volunteers according to general subject matter, and then numbered sequentially and placed into boxes according to subject. The collection was digitized with its current numbering system over a number of years, with digitization completed in 2023. In order to improve accessibility and enhance descriptions, Lanie Yaswinski was hired in August 2023 to edit the database entries and create finding aids for these digitized collections.

Scope and Content

This collection contains various materials related to Nazareth Hall, including early 18thand 19th-century organizational documents, financial records, correspondence, student catalogs and evaluations, examination dialogues, and records surrounding the transition to a military-style academy.

System of Arrangement

The records were previously organized at the item level according to general subject groups, however, during the current project some records pertinent to the subject group were found in other boxes in the collection. Since the records were digitized with a sequential numbering system, the physical system of arrangement remains intact. To improve accessibility and establish intellectual control over the subject group, records from various boxes are combined in the finding aid and organized chronologically.
