## Name of Creator

This collection of Nazareth business records was created by the Nazareth Diacony, various farm managers and businesses in the Nazareth area, and assembled by the Moravian Historical Society.

## Administrative/Biographical History

Moravians first arrived in Pennsylvania in 1740, establishing the settlements of Nazareth and Bethlehem, from where they coordinated mission efforts to evangelize Native Americans in the surrounding region. To support these efforts they formed a "General Economy" comprised of members working communally in trades, businesses and farms, which lasted until 1762. After this time businesses became privatized, although the church continued to own the land and regulate business practices within the communities until the 19th century.

The records in this group concern businesses in Nazareth and its surrounding farms and communities of Friedensthal, Gnadenthal and Christian's Spring. In addition, similar to other Moravian communities, Nazareth established a tavern and inn for visitors in 1752, which they called the Rose Tavern or the Rose Inn. The community store was built in close proximity to the tavern in 1763, and operated in this location until a second one was established in the new Nazareth town center around 1772. The tavern was also moved into the new town center around this time and operated as the Nazareth Inn. It was managed by the Moravian community until 1852-53, when it was sold to a private owner.

The Rose Tavern was also subsequently sold in 1771-72, and managed privately until it fell into disrepair and was torn down in 1858.

## **Archival History**

The Nazareth Businesses record group is an artificial collection with unknown provenance assembled and organized to facilitate its management or use. At this time it is not clear how this material came to be deposited at MHS; it may have belonged to the Nazareth congregation and placed here at some point. In the past it seems that the collection was organized at the item level by staff or volunteers according to general subject matter, and then numbered sequentially and placed into boxes according to subject. The collection was digitized with its current numbering system over a number of years, with digitization completed in 2023. In order to improve accessibility and enhance descriptions, Lanie Yaswinski was hired in August 2023 to edit the database entries and create finding aids for these digitized collections.

## **Scope and Content**

This collection is comprised of records pertaining to three groups: miscellaneous Nazareth businesses, the Nazareth Store and the inns of Nazareth (the Rose Tavern and later the Nazareth Inn). The first group includes financial records, primarily 18th-cent. ledgers and daybooks, pertaining to a variety of Nazareth businesses, including six ledgers from the Friendensthal mill and farm. The records are in no way comprehensive, but rather a miscellaneous collection of loosely related Nazareth businesses. The second group of records pertains to the Nazareth Store as it was first established near the Rose Tavern in 1763 and later moved to the new town center ten years later. Records include yearly inventories, ledger and daybook dating from the late 18th cent. The third group of records pertain to the inns of Nazareth, and is mostly comprised of yearly inventories.

## System of Arrangement

The records were previously organized at the item level according to general subject groups. Since the records were digitized with a sequential numbering system, the physical system of arrangement remains intact. To improve accessibility and establish intellectual control over the subject group, records are organized chronologically in the finding aid.
